

- Broken Chromebook



PARENT SQUARE: SIGNING IN


- Your account is automatically created using the phone number and email that you have listed in MISTAR.

 - After entering your email/phone number and clicking continue, you can reset your password yourself by clicking "Forgot password?"







Attendance Counts!

<u>Importance of Regular Attendance</u>: Regular attendance is KEY to academic achievement, and participation in class instruction, discussion & learning experiences cannot be replaced

<u>Tardy Policy/Hall Sweeps:</u> Being prompt and prepared for each class every hour is imperative! Consequences escalate from a warning to lunch detention to after school detention + loss of privileges to ISS to OSS and Oakland County Attendance Officer referral

<u>Truancy</u>: The Michigan Compulsory Attendance Law requires students under 18 years of age to attend school. When a child has more than 10 absences in a semester, whether excused or unexcused, it is considered excessive and may be investigated.

<u>Classroom Social Contracts & Syllabi (Parent Square)</u>: daily expectations and behaviors with choices & consequences
